

Jessica Dickinson was born in St. Paul, MN and has lived and worked in Brooklyn, New York since 1999. She received an MFA from Cranbrook Academy of Art in 1999 and BFA from Maryland Institute College of Art in 1997. Dickinson's work is represented by James Fuentes in New York and Altman Siegel Gallery in San Francisco.

Recent solo exhibitions include Altman Siegel Gallery, San Francisco (2016), James Fuentes, New York (2015), Altman Siegel Gallery, San Francisco (2013), David Petersen Gallery, Minneapolis (2013); Maisterravalbuena, Madrid (2012); and James Fuentes, NY (2011, 2009). Numerous group exhibitions include American University Art Museum, Washington D.C., Gladstone Gallery, New York; The Warehouse, Dallas; Eleni Koroneou Gallery, Athens; BiennaleOnline2013, selected by Nancy Spector; Painting in the 2.5th Dimension at The Zabłudowicz Collection, London; Come Through at Sikkema Jenkins, NY; and Besides, With, Against, and Yet: Abstraction and The Ready Made Gesture at The Kitchen, NY, curated by Debra Singer.

Dickinson's work has been reviewed and included in Artforum, Art in America, The Brooklyn Rail, and The New Yorker, among others. In 2015, the first monograph dedicated to Dickinson's work was published by Inventory Press, which includes an essay by Debra Singer and an interview with artist Patricia Treib.

Public collections include The Solomon R. Guggenheim Museum, New York, The Zabłudowicz Collection, London, and The Rachofsky Collection, Dallas, TX.

Dickinson's awards include an upcoming residency at Steep Rock Arts in Washinton, CT (2017), an individual grant from the Belle Foundation (2013), Farpath Residency in Dijon, France (2008), Change Inc Grant (2003) and The Marie Walsh Sharpe Art Foundation Space Program in New York (2001).

Dickinson has taught extensively, most recently as a Critic at Yale University School of Art and a Visiting Artist at Cooper Union School of Art. In Spring of 2018 Dickinson will be teaching at Columbia University School of The Arts.
